The year 2020 was a year that costed human lives and left fear and worry in everyone's hearts.

We have been, and will continue to, increase children's confidence and hope for a better world. For them, the isolation they experienced due the pandemic only deepened the challenges they face: no access to hygiene, unsafe housing, limited food, being forgotten by the education system due to limited access to an online education, and an increased risk of living on the street because parents had no money to pay rent and utilities.

In an instant everything changed around us, but we continued to offer hope, as much as possible. We asked the children to express their emotional experience of the pandemic year through a drawing. Their creativity and thoughts amazed us. We and the children continue to hope that everything will be fine.

“2020 has overturned our perception about what a movie is and what real life is. Until March 2020, when saying that truth is stronger than fiction, we imagined individual situations, people who were undergoing remarkable or tragic changes - but, almost always, it was about isolated cases.

Last year however, we all collectively understood how precious life is, both literally and figuratively. COVID-19 can affect anyone, no matter what a person’s age or social status. Some were lucky yet almost 5,000 others perished.

The families that CCF Moldova works with felt the full-scale economic, health, educational and emotional blows. It was these families in poverty who were affected the most, those with no money saved and too little help from elsewhere; 6-7 family members crowded in a room, using the same face mask for several days. Sanitisers and soap were a luxury. Children from families who barely had electricity, not to mention the internet and computers or telephones, attended lessons through intermediaries. But for children with special educational needs or disabilities, even intermediaries could no longer meet their needs.

COVID-19 has left deep emotional scars and it will take time, patience, hope and material resources to deal with them.

Where will happen to the thousands of families pushed by COVID-19 into poverty and despair?

When we think of “ours”, I urge you not to forget the children whose parents hope for a miracle to give them the basics, and that miracle can be done by us.

If we think of all children as “ours”, things will be simple. All children must be loved and protected.

I thank all our supporters and everyone individually, for your support offered in 2020 - a year that will forever remain in our collective memory.

Despite all the hardships and worries you felt, you did not give up helping a family and a child.

Because if we do not show solidarity in times of crisis, then when do we?”



Marin is 18 years old, and he spent the first 14 years of his life at the orphanage. He was placed in the institution by the authorities immediately after birth because his mother had neither a stable place to live nor enough resources to raise him. An additional reason for institutionalizing the child was his physical impairment. Unfortunately, we have seen such sad scenarios in the lives of many institutionalized children we have worked with over the years. Poverty and disability are among the first factors that separate children from their parents and steal their childhood.

Through our reintegration programme, Marin returned home in 2017. We offered both the mother and son qualified support, and most importantly a chance for Marin to have a normal life. Now, 4 years later, Marin is a student at a vocational school in the north of the country where he is learning how to operate computers. In the future he would like to apply for a theology course and become a priest. From a shy child he has since turned into an ambitious one. He has high hopes for the future and is grateful that he now has the stability and full support of his mother and a parental HOME to always welcome him back throughout his life.

*“I returned home in 2017 when I was in the seventh grade. Of course, most of my memories are related to the orphanage because I stayed there for 14 years. There I made friends with whom I still keep in touch. Now they are all at home, each with their own interests and lives.*

*I have been in the family for 4 years and I can say that it is totally different from what I had experienced up to that point. You can't do as many things the way you like. You have certain responsibilities towards your loved ones, especially towards your mother, who worries when you hang out with friends. I have a special respect for her. I thank her for loving and caring for me. She does her best so I can study here at vocational school. And on Saturdays, when I go home, she cooks homemade food for me for the whole week.*

*In the future, I want to start a big family with many children, and I will definitely take a child or two from the orphanage to show them what a real family looks like. Where they will be liked, loved and protected by everyone. This is my big dream. To help people.”*

We firmly believe that, in the best interests of all children, the family is a priority. That is why, since 2007, when the Republic of Moldova initiated the strategic process of reforming the child protection system, we have provided technical assistance to the authorities to close all residential institutions in the country. During the implementation of the reform, the number of children in institutions decreased dramatically; from 12,000 children in 2007 to fewer than 1,000 children according to 2019 data.

We consider our work to have played an important role in the success of this reform. In partnership with authorities, in the last 16 years, we have managed to close down 10 institutions from different regions of the country, helping transition over 1,504 children back into a family environment.

We will continue to provide technical assistance to all stakeholders involved in this process – to directly support families and develop services until there are no more orphanages in our country and every child grows up at home, in a family.

## WHY DO WE CLOSE RESIDENTIAL INSTITUTIONS?

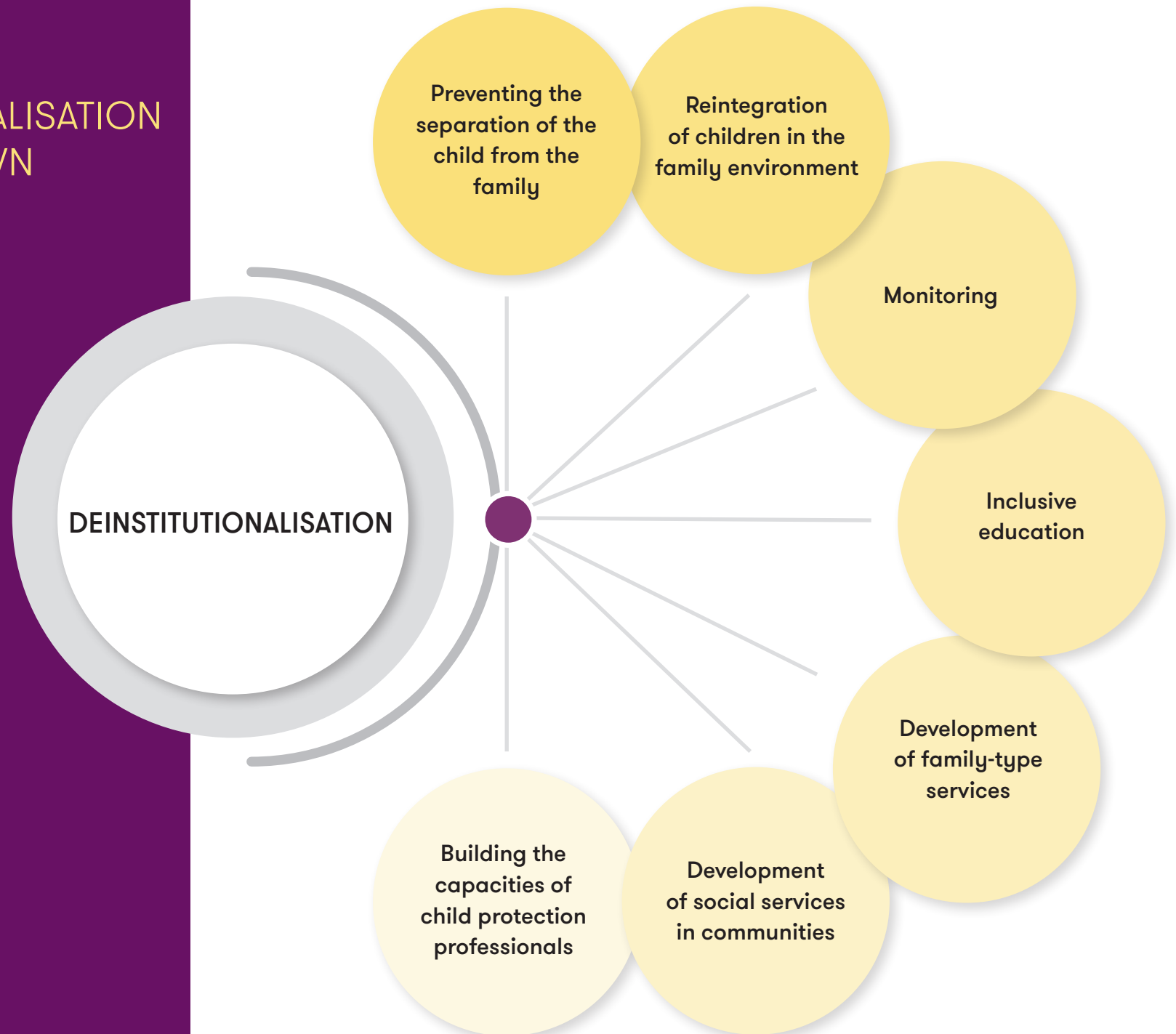
Most children in orphanages are not actually orphans.

Over **90%** of them have one or both parents alive. Residential institutions do not protect children, they only respond to their physical needs. They affect them for a long period. These children are often subjected to hidden abuse or neglect. They live in a world without love, and the consequences are devastating for the rest of their lives. Children raised in institutions show delays in physical, emotional, social and cognitive development. These models of child “protection” are unnecessary and long outdated, because children can be successfully reintegrated into their natural or extended families, or they can be placed in alternative forms of family and community care. These alternatives are economically much more efficient and effective than orphanages. Children really thrive in loving families which provide a safe environment, regardless of family composition. It is their fundamental right to be raised in a family. So, let’s raise them at home.



## WHAT IS DEINSTITUTIONALISATION (CLOSING DOWN INSTITUTIONS)?

Deinstitutionalisation is a process that consists of a complex set of measures by which children in state care (orphanages) are reintegrated in their biological or extended family or are transferred to alternative family-type services, thus giving them what they need the most – a loving and stable family nest.

is an essential component in eradicating children's institutionalisation in the Republic of Moldova. Poverty and disability can affect parents' care and attachment to their children. In some cases, parents and professionals could think that children would be "better off" in an institution. And yet, in most of these cases, family support, access to necessary services, social benefits and family-type solutions would help the child to stay in the family.

We firmly believe that, in the best interests of the child, family is the priority. Therefore, we provide assistance through a diversified approach to support children to stay with their parents.

Over the last 16 years, through the programme on preventing the separation of the child from the family, Child, Community, Family helped **2,305 children** to stay with their families, of which 174 – in 2020.



One of them is Nichita. He is only one year-old and last year his mother and father needed support to stand on their own feet, so we helped him to remain with his parents. The young mother is an orphan and without a support network, so it would have been difficult for them to cope with their difficulties alone. We were around when Nichita was born, then we helped the father obtain IDs, and later we helped them move to the north of the country where they found a house and are already in the process of purchasing it. The father got employed and today all three form a happy family, determined to overcome all of life's obstacles together.

## REINTEGRATION OF CHILDREN IN THE FAMILY ENVIRONMENT

is the action of integrating deinstitutionalised children into a family if they have biological or extended families that can offer them appropriate conditions. If the biological or extended family are not suitable or available, the child can be placed in the care of foster parents.

Our vision is a world in which no child will ever have to go through the trauma of institutionalisation. In 2020, we were able to integrate **64 children** back into families to be raised where they feel the best. This brings the total number of children who left orphanages, from 2007 to the present, to **1,504**.

Maxim (6 years old) was born with cerebral palsy, a condition that affects his control and muscle movement. His mother left home when he was still a baby. Since then, his father, Alexandru, has fought against poverty and prejudice in order to take care of Maxim and his daughter, Mihaela, on his own. Without a helping hand they needed so much, their lives were a daily struggle for survival. Thus, two days before Christmas, when Maxim was only three years old, he was taken from his home and placed in an orphanage where he spent the next three years. Mihaela was also taken from her father and sent to live with relatives.



Their separation lasted three years. But, in collaboration with the local authorities, with qualified support and a well-developed individualized plan, we succeeded in reuniting the family. We also provided practical and material support so that Alexandru could renovate part of his house; the rest of the renovation he took care of by himself. Once the home was safe and warm, Mihaela returned home first, followed soon after by Maxim. Now all three are together. The girl goes to school, and the boy spends all day in Alexander's care and has progressed considerably. In just a few months since he has been home, he can stand on his own feet and eats solid food for the first time. We will continue to support Alexandru and the children this year as well, to fortify everyone's efforts thus far.

## MONITORING

To ensure the successful reintegration of a child in the family, we monitor the situation for up to 2 years, or longer in more complex situations. Monitoring is a vital step which involves regular visits, assessing the child and family's well-being, identifying the warning signs, and early intervention to help them reach a certain level of social stability. Only through monitoring, together with community social workers, can we ensure a child's well-being. Each of us know that change takes time and a lot of effort.

In 2020, **434 children** and their families have benefited from this support. Three of them are sisters; Maria, Ioana and Olga.



Three years ago, Ana was left alone to raise her three daughters immediately after her youngest was born. In despair, with no money and no place to live, the woman lived from hand to mouth. When she was informed that her daughters could end up in state care if the situation did not improve, she felt like the ground was falling out from beneath her feet.

Maria, Ioana and Olga are all that she has dearest in her life. For two years we helped her get her life in order and helped her to buy a house where the four of them could start a new and safe life together.

Today they form a beautiful and united family. Every time we visit them, the small team of girls greets us with smiles and many hugs. They are grateful and happy for all the good fortune that has happened to them lately.

## INCLUSIVE EDUCATION

is a set of policies, structures and services used to provide support and rehabilitation to children with disabilities both in the educational process and their social inclusion, to avoid marginalisation, social exclusion and as a result, institutionalisation. We assist all stakeholders involved in this process: children, parents, and teachers. We strongly believe in an inclusive society and strive for every child to have equal access and opportunities in community schools and to grow up beautifully at home.

In 2020, we helped **111 children** with special educational needs, aged between 3 and 14, to be well integrated into mainstream education.



Ancuța is one of them. We met her at the end of 2019 when we offered her rehabilitation sessions for children with a hearing impairment. She was three years old and could hardly speak, slurring a few sounds. But 2020 has brought radical changes to the child's life. She received a cochlear implant from the state, and we completed this intervention with auditory-verbal therapy sessions. We also trained and informed her parents and kindergarten specialists how to work with Ancuța to maintain and further her progress.

Today, at the age of 4, she recognizes what sounds domestic animals make, identifies the sounds of musical instruments, utters a few letters and even words, and easily recognizes her name. She is well integrated in the village kindergarten where she started to make friends within her group.

We will continue to help Ancuța and her mother with rehabilitation sessions, to fortify everyone's efforts so far.

## DEVELOPMENT OF FAMILY-TYPE SERVICES

When closing down institutions, we pay special attention to the development of necessary services. For this reason, we support the state in identifying and training foster parents and parent-educators from family-type homes who become loving and welcoming families for children at risk for a defined period of time.

Sometimes children cannot remain in their family due to the danger of abuse or they do not have relatives who can or would like to raise them. In such cases, alternative families represent the best option for these children. Here they are given the chance to grow up in the warmth of a family home.

In 2020, with our direct involvement, 28 foster parents were approved, out of a total of **332** accumulated over the years.



We have helped hundreds of children to leave orphanages and be raised in family environments, but for the first time, in 2020, we managed to place a group of 4 brothers under the age of 3 into a foster family. It was an emergency placement. Sonia and Petru are a hard-working family who live modestly, but their hearts are full of affection. Immediately after they were approved to become foster parents, they welcomed the 4 brothers into their arms.

If it were not for this family, the fate of the siblings would have been the orphanage. Life hadn't been too good to them since their birth, but thanks to these wonderful people their fate has now changed. The brothers now have a chance to have a real and happy childhood. They are lucky to have a role model of a MOTHER and a FATHER, who give them all the love and care they need.

## DEVELOPMENT OF SOCIAL SERVICES IN COMMUNITIES

In order to prevent the abandonment of children and to keep them in family environments where they can develop harmoniously, we need social services located as close as possible to vulnerable families. So far, we have developed **24 services** (nurseries, day centers, after school clubs, and a small group home) and transferred them to authorities for financing and management, but we monitor them in order to maintain the quality.

In 2020, thanks to **the partnership between Biotehnos and CCF Moldova, we developed the first social creche in Criuleni district.**



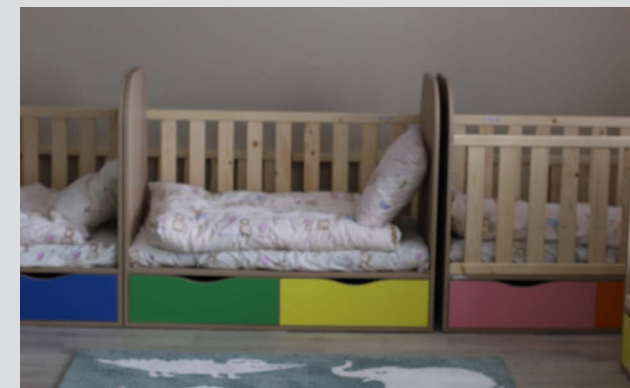
We have always encouraged and assisted the initiatives of Local Public Authorities interested in creating and diversifying their support services for vulnerable groups of children. We signed a cooperation agreement with Criuleni LPA in 2016, the year in which we started the reorganization and closure of the residential sections in the Republican Institution for Babies.

Ceslav Ciuhrii and Biotehnos Company helped us financially and supported the initiative to create this first social creche in Criuleni. The value of the project was 841,829 MDL; resources that allowed us to completely repair the premises offered by the local authorities and to procure the necessary equipment.



*“Happy, cared for and well-educated children from a very young age mean better people in the future. It means that children will be able to spread the good around them later. That is why I chose to support families with small children”,* said Ceslav Ciuhrii at the official opening of the service.

The social creche is located inside the “Mesteacănul” kindergarten and has a capacity of 14 children. The approach of professionals in this service is different from that of specialists in a kindergarten because children of different ages (from 4 months to 3 years) come here at the same time. Emphasis is on the individual needs of the little ones, avoiding the rigidity of a predetermined schedule such as a fixed time for food, sleep, and play. In addition to initial staff training, our team continues to mentor the employees and help them to overcome the challenges together.



**BUILDING

For 16 years we have been contributing to raising the efficiency of the child protection system. We offer trainings on a variety of topics to help specialists in this field become a real protection shield for vulnerable children, to be well informed, and to act within the legal framework in the best interests of children. We believe that it is only together with professionals, who are also compassionate people, that we can change the lives of children who need us, thus change the whole of humankind for the better.

The motto that guides us is “Families. Not orphanages”.

During our **16 years** of activity, we have trained **5,385 specialists**. In 2020, CCF Moldova organized training courses for **808 child** protection professionals.

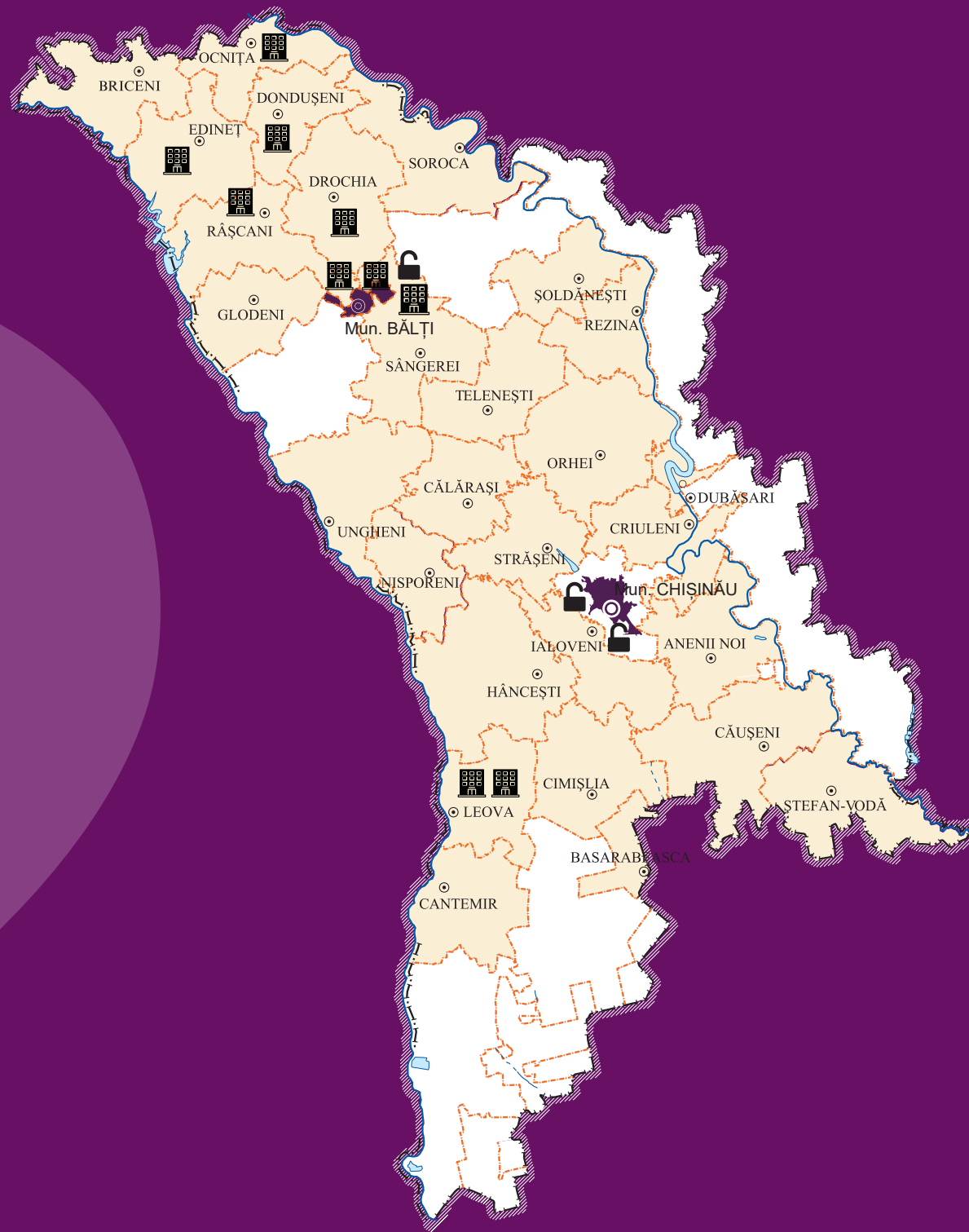

783 children.**

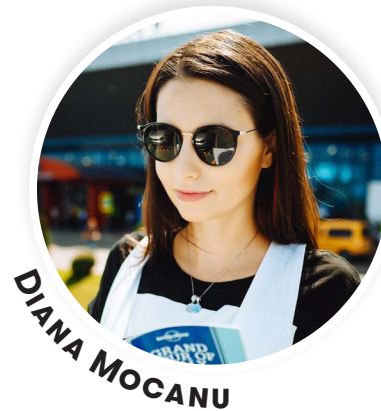
The online environment brought us together for two “**Night of Adventures**” events with Iulian Bercu and top “adventurers”, united to help two families with seven children.

In April, two of the nine Moldovans who had recently returned from an expedition to the other side of the world, **Anatol** and **Dan Untură**, shared with us first-hand details about their conquest of Antarctica. The over 80 participants in attendance were fascinated by the stories shared.

A little later in the year, in August, we hosted a second event where three extraordinary women were invited to talk about their experiences. It was a really exciting occasion. Travel blogger – **Diana Mocanu**, professional stunt performer – **Diana Arnaut**, and Major in the National Army – **Natalia Lefter**, responded to our invitation to share their stories to help benefit children assisted by our programmes.

Although both events of **Night of Adventures with Iulian Bercu** in 2020 were held online, they continued to be traditionally hosted by our TV presenter and dear friend, Gabi Marcu. Our partner Dor Wines took care that our events were bubbly as well.

**Together we managed to raise significant support for 7 children from 2 families.**



## Art for the benefit of children.

A charity auction held by renowned artists to help two brothers and their grandmother.



Isolated in our homes, we could not in any way pretend that we did not see how poverty, amplified by the pandemic, was devastating many families, keeping them hungry, scared, and desperate. With every message received from our organization's friends, we kept knocking on people's doors either directly or through the social assistance departments offering the help that they needed.

"I follow you and I am sick at heart for many children who are suffering now in an even worse way. What can I do? How can I help to lighten their burden?", artist **Cezara Kolesnik** asked us in the Spring, at the beginning of the pandemic. Friends in need are friends indeed, we told ourselves! Although art and culture were brought down, human solidarity prevailed. **Eugeniu Gorean, Krassimir Savov, Anca Medrea** and **Natalia Gârbu** responded to Caesara's call, each donating a piece of artwork for the online auction. This important support contributed to an unexpected change in the situation of Anastasia and Ion, who remained in the care of their grandmother. The house they live in has been completely transformed, becoming safer, brighter and more spacious. In addition to improving their living space, we created conditions for accessing online lessons, and for Anastasia to take part in hearing impairment rehabilitation sessions.



Over **225 runners** took part in the **# 2.7 Poverty Independence Challenge** and **raised money** for **270 children** to give them access to an education.



Between 20 and 27 August, 225 runners from the Run for Children Team accepted the **# 2.7 Poverty Independence Challenge**, launched by CCF Moldova's Ambassador, Iulian Bercu, on the eve of the school year. Thanks to a joint effort, **5,124 km were accumulated in total**. This helped us to collect financial resources for **270 children** from disadvantaged social backgrounds, giving them access to an education. After the first six months of the pandemic, the crisis affected not only the healthcare system, but all state systems; social, educational, and economic. We were at the beginning of a new school year when the transition to a new type of remote learning was announced. As for nurseries, they remained closed. For the families of 270 children, the crisis deepened the worries parents had and, in many cases, poverty triggered the risk of children dropping out of school.

For 7 days, the fundraiser runners covered distances from 2.7 to 270 km each, running individually to comply with social distancing regulations imposed due to the pandemic. There were also eight corporate teams that enthusiastically accepted the challenge in the name of the children. They were **Purcari Wines, Moldova Agroindbank, Be Travod, Wordminds, Premier Energy, Development Aid, Bizlaw** and **ERA** (Efim Roșca Associated).

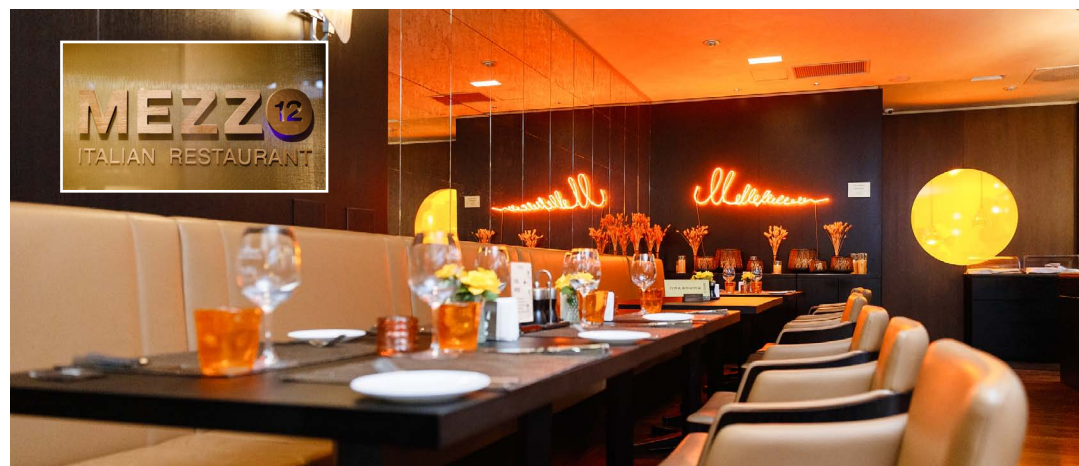

On 6 September, the International Day of Charity, CCF/HHC Moldova's Ambassadors for Philanthropy, **Lucia** and **Dorian Berdos** together with the Mezzo restaurant team, invited guests to spend an evening in a rather different way. The warmth and care of Elena, a young mother juggling motherhood and studies, was reflected in the dinner's specially prepared menu and warm atmosphere.

With the generous support of the hosts and guests, we managed to help the mother both parenting and her studies perfectly. Elena is a first-year college student with a good academic performance and a loving mother to her one-year-old daughter. She chose to study social work, convinced that she can also help society. She wants to be useful to people who need care and support. She grew up without the affection of her parents and lived with her grandparents for a while, until they passed away. At the time, Elena was very young and ended up in state care where she lacked the most important answers during different stages of childhood and adolescence. She experienced first-hand a troubled childhood, the lack of a trustworthy adult, and felt what it means to be socially excluded.



## Immunized with generosity in a new format of THE GALA OF GENEROSITY 2020

On the eve of Saint Nicolas, on 5 December, TV8.MD exclusively hosted our 7th edition of the GALA OF GENEROSITY concert.



Although we had a hundred reasons to do so, by no means could we postpone the **Gala of Generosity** in this pandemic year. With a lot of courage and support from our patron, **Valentina Nafornița**, we adapted the event in line with the imposed restrictions and together with our reliable partners Victoriabank – Banca Transilvania Group, Purcari Wine and Felicia Foundation, we succeeded this time as well. It was a very emotional experience.

*“I am extremely grateful to you that we are here together today, now in these difficult times for us, not to mention how difficult it is for children from poor families and their parents”,* said Valentina Nafornița during the dinner part of the gala event.

Traditionally, the dinner was once again hosted by Mezzo Italian Restaurant and followed by a charity auction in which unique experiences and items were donated by artists, businessmen and supporters of CCF Moldova. The legendary Valentina Vidrașcu and her unique creations were indispensable this year. Ladies who wanted to own such a masterpiece in their wardrobe donated generously, knowing that it would contribute directly to the children cared for by CCF Moldova. This year the auction also attracted new artists such as Galina Vieru, Roman Rybaleov and Sanda Cebotari, as well as other famous brands such as Simona’s Home and Florentino Delure.

Another novelty of this year’s event was the exceptional recital given by soprano singer Valentina Nafornița, pianist Marcel Lazăr, and actor and TV presenter Iurie Gologan, who moderated the event.

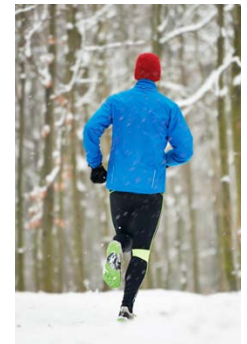
**Between 7 and 27 December 2020, a Marathon of Miracles took place, launched by CCF Moldova together with Ambassador Iulian Bercu.**

For twenty days, 54 runners, grouped in teams of three, completed the MARATHON, out of the desire to bring a miracle to the lives of 700 children. Throughout this period, thanks to donations from runners, supporters, and generous people who believe in CCF Moldova's work, we managed to collect MDL 77,047. With this money, in the coming months we will help children affected by poverty to be raised at home with their parents. They are all children from our reintegration and prevention programs.

## **18 teams of people who truly believe in miracles!**

We must mention that in addition to speed and stamina, the teams also showed creativity. They were very ingenious with their team names.

**14,000 km** was the new record achieved and the first seven teams that reached **700 km** each were generously rewarded with prizes by our partners: **Garmin Moldova, Chateau Vartely, AZART Outlet, Fourchette Gourmet and Avante Moldova.**



## **17 companies** from our country chose to mark the winter holidays in a different way by involving their teams in social responsibility initiatives

In December, a period that brings us closer to the most beautiful holidays of the year, we launched the #Caring for Children Campaign, which will continue into 2021. In an effort to create opportunities to involve the whole of society, we decided to sensitize people of this country and tell them how much suffering some children endure because of poverty. In the first 3 weeks of October, 28 children were enlisted in the CCF Moldova family support program, compared to 71 children who were registered in the first nine months of the year. It is a worrying number for both the organization and local authorities who do not have sufficient financial resources to support vulnerable families.

In extreme poverty, parents become desperate. They do not know how to cope with food shortages, limited access to education, and how to keep the roof over their heads. To help them overcome these difficult situations, we organised 3 thematic activities which companies could do for the benefit of children:



### **Christmas Jumper Day**

A fun activity for the entire team, even in an online environment. The condition was that on a day agreed in advance, all participants had to wear a Christmas sweater or Christmas accessories. Some ingenious people even baked edible sweaters (cakes, biscuits) to be enjoyed with family or colleagues. The donations started at MDL 100, and were later doubled by the company.

### **Happy Envelopes**

This activity, which lasted between 7 and 10 days, urged employees to donate colourful and beautifully decorated envelopes to hang on a wall, specially reserved for CCF Moldova's cause. Generous donors left a financial contribution in the envelopes (which was later doubled by the companies) and also shared heart-felt messages. In the case of the FELICIA foundation and pharmacy, the amount was tripled.

The ongoing partnership between CCF Moldova and Mary Kay Moldova. For Mary Kay, the beauty is not just outside, they decided to spread love and kindness to disadvantaged children.



CCF Moldova and Mary Kay continued the strategic partnership which started in 2019, through which the company donates quarterly in support of the prevention program, an essential part of the deinstitutionalization process.

The partnership signed between Mary Kay and CCF Moldova is from 2019 to 2023, and in 2020 they kindly donated MDL 54,175. With this money we helped 67 children from 32 families in our monitoring program. All the children had been helped in previous years to be placed out of orphanages.

A safe **HOME** was offered to 61 children, from 20 families, through the **HOME** Project, supported by the EBRD Community Initiative, the STURZA FAMILY Foundation and the WIN Foundation

The Home Project first started in 2009 when we bought the first house for a family that had nowhere to take their children from the residential institution. The parents were able to run a household, but a lack of financial resources made them believe that **THEIR HOME** would remain just a dream. The lack of a house was the reason why the parents themselves had grown up in an orphanage, and a generation later, their own children had “inherited” a similarly unfortunate situation. The vicious circle broke immediately however when we bought a house for this family.

Since then, the project has grown thanks to the annual support offered by the STURZA FAMILY Foundation, but also from other resources, which we had been attracting through diaspora, local organizations and media campaigns. Collectively, between 2009 and 2020, we changed the lives of 138 children by managing to raise MDL 2,073,230. Each intervention was a response to the families’ need. For some we purchased houses, and for others we renovated houses that were in a deplorable state and were endangering the lives of children and parents.

In 2020, with the support of CCF Moldova Ambassador, Mariana Dahan, the WIN Foundation and the STURZA FAMILY Foundation, we raised over MDL 315,000. This amount was generously doubled by the EBRD Community Initiative. With the MDL 637,075, we offered a safe home to 61 children from 20 families, by helping to renovate, repair or purchase homes, tailoring intervention according to their needs. Importantly, we were able to eliminate the risk of children being separated from their families in situations where a damaged house could have been a strong reason for their separation.

## The **EBRD** Community Initiative helps children and families to overcome the COVID-19 crisis

Between July and December 2020, CCF Moldova and the EBRD Community Initiative carried out the project “Support for children and families in overcoming the COVID-19 crisis”. Through this project we provided specific interventions to 140 children from various regions of the country.

According to a quick survey conducted by the CCF Moldova team, during the first months of the pandemic, **54%** of the interviewed parents reported a decrease or loss of income compared to January-February. The COVID-19 crisis has primarily affected vulnerable families.

All families were either at a high risk of separation or had children in residential institutions. The aim of the project was to support and enable parents to identify resources to deal with the crisis by providing them with emotional, social and educational support. In order to respond to their prevailing needs, we identified a series of tools that we applied for the beneficiary families. We provided the following types of assistance: family counselling, facilitating access to social services and benefits, legal advice and counselling, and support in identifying jobs. The value of the project was **MDL 984,226**.



## “Innovation for donation in the new COVID-19 reality” new opportunities for community engagement

Between July 2020 and July 2021, with the financial support of The German Marshall Fund, The Black Sea Trust for Regional Cooperation, we are implementing the “Innovation for donation in the new Covid reality” project. Its purpose is to create a digital platform that on the one hand offers the whole community accessible donation options, whilst on the other hand offers local NGOs, who are interested in acquiring new fundraising skills and involvement in community work, access to an e-learning course on fundraising techniques and ways to stimulate a culture of philanthropy in the Republic of Moldova.



The necessity for this program is framed in the context of needing to adapt to the new reality of COVID-19, which is pushing us to redirect our fundraising efforts online and to mainly operate in a digital environment. The German Marshall Fund offered us **MDL 420 465** for this project.

The new platform [www.donatii.md](http://www.donatii.md) is dedicated to the development of opportunities for community involvement and consolidation of civic spirit and social solidarity in the Republic of Moldova. Citizens are offered accessible and safe ways to help the most vulnerable social groups in the country, namely children who are at imminent risk of separation from their families due to poverty.

Access to health services for every child through home visits, a cross-border project **funded by the European Union**



From 1 April 2020 to 30 September 2021, CCF Moldova, in partnership with the Star of Hope Romania Foundation, with the financial support of the European Union through the European Neighborhood Instrument (ENI), through the Joint Operational Programme Romania-Republic of Moldova 2014- 2020, is implementing the project “Access to health services for every child through Home Visiting”.

Both countries face problems in ensuring access to equitable health services. According to the assessment \* conducted by the Institute of Mother and Child in 2014, 30% of children aged 0-12 months from vulnerable families in Moldova are not monitored in accordance with supervision standards regarding a child’s growth and development in an outpatient setting and 5% of infants from vulnerable families do not benefit from at least two home visits by health care professionals in their first months. Children and families in rural areas have reduced access to health services, which can affect early diagnosis, intervention and rehabilitation of children.

Thus, through the project activities we target at eliminating the existing inequities, especially in the case of the most marginalized groups. The project activities are focused on:

- informing parents about the benefits of immunization, dismantling myths and increasing the rate of immunization among children
- improving abilities to care for their own children, which allows a safe environment for children to be developed, but also to identify early developmental disorders or health problems.
- information and support in accessing services for parents of children with disabilities, according to availability in the area.

An innovative element brought by the project is the combination of the Home Visiting model with the Community Based Rehabilitation (CBR) model which is a strategy promoted by the World Health Organization that promotes the rights of children with disabilities through changes that occur at the community level.

In 2020, **107 health professionals** have been trained. It is estimated that **1700 children** and **pregnant women** will benefit from the activities carried out within the project. .

The integrated model on interventions for the inclusion of children with severe disabilities in Sangerei district, in partnership with **UNICEF Moldova**

From October 2019 to January 2021, with the support and partnership of UNICEF, CCF Moldova continued to develop a system of assistance and inclusion, focused on intersectoral collaboration under the project “Integrated model of interventions for assistance and inclusion of children with severe disabilities in Sangerei district”. These actions strengthened the first phase of the project, initiated in 2018, which evaluated the situation regarding the individual approach, data collection, mapping of services, evaluation of their quality, and intersectoral cooperation.



In 2020, the project tested the integrated model of assistance and inclusion of children with severe disabilities in Sangerei district based on a guide, developed by UNICEF and supplemented by a group of national experts, to be later integrated into the existing national policies, but also in other initiatives.

Over 230 specialists benefited from information, training and mentoring sessions throughout the project implementation period, so as to respond promptly and effectively to the needs of the child and family. According to them and the research carried out in the last phase of the project, the support and inclusion services offered to children with severe disabilities have improved.

Approximately 300 children with disabilities from Sangerei district will continue to benefit from care services of a higher quality.

**“Specialists from Sangerei district, especially from those 3 pilot localities, demonstrated that in the 10 months of piloting they improved their skills, had access to assessment, communication and data exchange tools, but, most importantly, they realized the role of the family in assisting a child with disabilities and supported the family to meet the needs of the children”,** said Liliana Rotaru, Chairperson of Child, Community, Family Moldova.

**14 schools** from Sangerei and Straseni districts promote inclusive values, and the school environment has become a child-friendly community

From June 2019 to December 2020, the project “Strong through diversity – applying the inclusion index” was launched in partnership with ChildFund Deutschland and with financial support from the German Ministry of Foreign Affairs.



The project was based on the Inclusion Index, developed by education expert Tony Booth from the UK, which is used in over 30 countries around the world. The inclusion index suggests to schools how to operate on the basis of inclusive values and self-assessment, providing accurate tools in the interaction with parents and children. The project provided benefits to approximately **1,500 children** in the **14 selected schools**, about **200 teachers** who learned to implement the Inclusion Index, and **30 key stakeholders** involved in the decision-making process in the education system.

*“This project is important because we, the teachers, are the ones who should start the change, to find the key for every child and family. Of course, we are working in this direction, but obviously there are aspects that need to be improved”,* said Victoria Stamatina, the Deputy Director for education of “Olimp” high school.

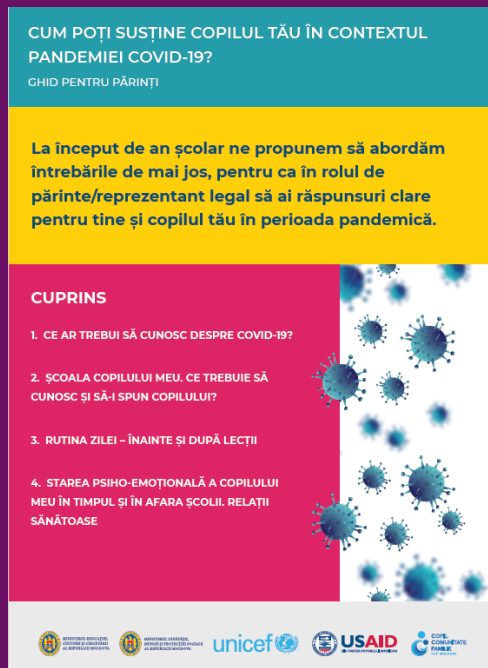
**“Germany and the European Union have a strong interest in developing the EU’s neighbouring regions, implementing economic, social and political reforms, and promoting democracy and prosperity. The project implemented by the 14 schools is a viable example of how living conditions can be improved at a local level, how processes can be strengthened, and sustainable development can be ensured in accordance with European Union standards”,** said Ullrich Kinne, Permanent Representative of the German Ambassador to Chisinau.



In October and November 2020, Moldova and Germany exchanged experience on inclusion in education. German authority representatives and representatives of educational structures and institutions spoke about the achievements in the field of inclusive education in their country, presenting a series of examples, challenges and solutions. The participants talked about the institution they manage, the adopted strategic approach, and offered detailed suggestions on improving the education system. Claudia Neubert, project manager at ChildFund, mentioned that the experience exchange program targets 3 different levels of the German education system: policies, structures and institutional.

The Permanent Representative of the German Ambassador to Chisinau, Ullrich Kinne, thanked the participants for their commitment to turning schools into child-friendly communities.

# Strengthening the knowledge and skills of managers and teachers in schools and residential institutions on the prevention of COVID-19 and infectious diseases



The educational process, in the context of the pandemic, remains a great challenge for both students and parents as well as for teachers. From September 2020 to May 2021, with the support of UNICEF Moldova, we are implementing the project “Supporting WASH actions and strengthening the knowledge and skills of managers and teaching staff in schools and residential institutions on the prevention and management of COVID-19 and infectious diseases”.

A safe school for all children. Even though education during the pandemic period has experienced new challenges, while taking precautions, children and adults can protect themselves from COVID-19.

Teachers and parents will make sure that all children feel protected, understood and supported. The project developed a parent’s guide, which offers a series of tips and useful information about children’s physical and emotional health.

The guide is in Romanian and Russian and was developed and approved by the Ministry of Education, Culture and Research of the Republic of Moldova, in collaboration with the Ministry of Health, Labor and Social Protection of the Republic of Moldova. The project also developed 25 useful Q&As for teachers in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic.

From September to December 2020, more than **9360 specialists** were trained online, participating in **313 sessions**.

The meetings were very interactive and focused on 3 important issues:

- medical and prevention measures of COVID-19 infection in children and adults;
- carrying out the educational process in the context of COVID-19;
- the well-being of the student, teacher, and parent.

All project activities are carried out in collaboration with **The Ministry of Education, Culture and Research of the Republic of Moldova**.

## “THE MEANING OF FASTING” CAMPAIGN

For the fourth consecutive year, on the eve of Lent, CCF/HHC Moldova carried out the social campaign “The Meaning of Fasting”. People were invited to visit a virtual restaurant, to choose the dishes they would have eaten, and donate what they would have spent towards a noble cause – eliminating the risk of children being abandoned in residential institutions by supporting children from poor families who often go to bed hungry. Over 164 people responded to our call and donated the equivalent of their dishes online on [www.rostulpostului.md](http://www.rostulpostului.md).



About **MDL 62,000** was collected through the campaign; money with which we bought food, but also domestic animals, seedlings and plants to help families provide themselves with necessary food.

**Redirect 2%** and  
keep a child at home



In 2020, we promoted and encouraged people to exercise their right to redirect 2% of their income tax for the previous year to CCF Moldova. The state approved this mechanism in 2017 to allow individuals paying taxes the freedom to decide, between 1 January and 30 April, what they want to do with their money. Thus, through a simple and transparent procedure, they can offer the chance to every child in the country to grow up in a safe and protected family environment.

As a result, in the autumn of 2020, **MDL 63,627** was transferred to our organization's account. With this money we helped **11 children** to have a better life with their loved ones.

## Supporting the medical system in the fight against **COVID-19**

CCF Moldova and Coca Cola Foundation joined forces to support the immediate needs of the medical system in the difficult fight against the coronavirus pandemic

A chance to take care of the most vulnerable, to mobilize for the safety and well-being of those around us, to find friends and partners for a joint struggle. At the beginning of the coronavirus pandemic, together with our partners we joined humankind in the fight for life and health. In response to this unprecedented situation and challenging conditions in a global crisis, CCF Moldova, with the financial support of the Coca Cola Foundation, purchased essential equipment for the country’s medical system to fight the COVID-19 virus. Four medical institutions in Chisinau were provided with equipment of vital importance for patients infected with the new virus: haematological analysers, two vein detectors and a high-performance USG machine.

We are grateful to our partners for the ways they have mobilised. Only by joining forces will we be able to overcome the pandemic.



A fundraising campaign launched by **EBA Moldova** in collaboration with **CCF Moldova**



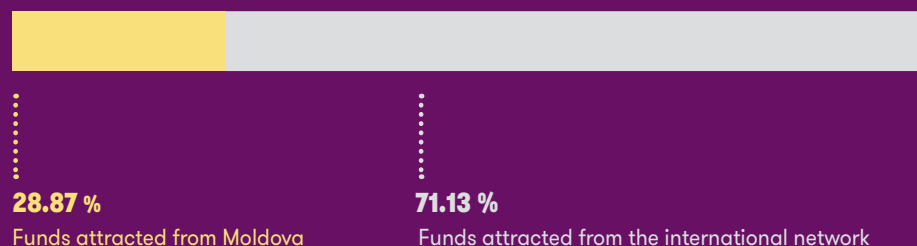
